When your hospice provides a patient with direct care by a registered nurse or social worker during the last seven days of life, you can bill Medicare at an hourly rate in addition to the routine home care (RHC) rate.

This Medicare Service Intensity Add-Ons (SIA) initiative was designed to ensure that the level of hospice care continuously matches the changing physical and emotional needs for patients and their families. In turn, it financially rewards hospices for improved care and attention. Yet since SIA was initiated in 2016, few hospices have taken full advantage of it, citing staffing issues and an inability to determine when their patients have just a few weeks left to live.

Right now, your hospice may be missing the opportunity to get more control over scheduling, reduce staff burnout, and improve quality scores.
